ELIGIBILITY

- A Hope for Suffolk graduate or participant who ended their internship season in good standing
- All candidates must be planning to pursue post-secondary education (trade/vocational school, two-year college, or a four-year university)
- Has not won the Hope for Suffolk scholarship in previous years

CRITERIA

- o Each candidate will write a 500–750-word essay responding to ONE of the following prompts. Please be sure to state which prompt you will be responding to on the application
 - 1. Write a 500–750-word essay that describes areas in your life where you demonstrated leadership and overcame obstacles either through your community, school, social, or family life.
 - 2. Write a 500–750-word essay explaining the importance of growing organic and treating the environment well.
 - 3. Write an essay in 500-750 words explaining what it means to be a good student in the community, on the field (to be a participant in extra-curricular activities), and in the classroom. Explain how you exemplified this.
 - 4. In 500-750 words, reflect on your experiences as a Hope for Suffolk Intern and how it has shaped your goals. How do you plan to leverage your education for positive change in your community?
 - 5. In 500-750 words, discuss the impact of Hope for Suffolk on your personal and professional development. How has it influenced your values, leadership skills, and commitment to social responsibility?
 - 6. In 500-750 words, explain how receiving this scholarship will further your educational and career objectives, enabling you to make a lasting contribution to the community.
- o One letter of recommendation (no relatives)
- o Official OR Unofficial transcript
- o Resume
- o Complete scholarship application

PROCEDURE

- COMPLETE applications must be submitted to the Hope for Suffolk office by Friday, March 1, 2024.. (Complete applications include all requested materials, and a complete application)
- Candidates will participate in a formal interview (Date TBA)
- Selected recipients will receive their funds once they have graduated from high school and have proof of enrollment to their post-secondary institution.
